III. Richard M. Lebowich passed away Sunday, January 23, 2011 at the Saratoga Hospital following an extended illness. He was born in Saratoga, NY on May 18, 1936 and is survived by his wife, Sally. A brother and sister predeceased Dick in 1997 and 1998. Dick graduated from Boston University in 1958 and was honorably discharged from the United States Army Reserves following six years of service. Dick and Sally were married on June 30, 1962 in Forest Hills, NY.

Dick worked for more than 35 years in the insurance industry and was very active in every community where he and Sally resided.

In 1961 he joined Rising Sun Lodge #103 in Saratoga where he was master for the 2006-07 year. After moving to Greenwich he joined Ashlar Lodge and was master for the 1994-95 year. He served as District Deputy Grand Master of Washington District. In October 1992 he became a 32 degree Mason and later was sovereign prince for the Troy Delta Bodies. On October 31, 1992, Dick joined Oriental Shrine, was transportation chairman from 1995-2008 and Potentate in 2005. Dick and Sally worked the Shrine Bingo in Schenectady for more than a decade.

Do You Know?

— Answers to Dec., '10 Questions —

1) Noble Malcolm Ogden reported in the May 1994 issue of The Oriental News that the beverage tab collection began in March 1990 by the Ladies Oriental Shrine of North America, Helma Court #64. Soda can tabs were collected for a child on a kidney dialysis machine. The child died before the fundraising was done. The National Kidney Foundation said there was no program to help other children. With many tabs coming in, the ladies of Helma Court #64 decided to apply the project of collecting tabs and beverage cans to the Shriners Hospital in Springfield and the Boston Burns Unit to help buy needed equipment and other materials that the hospital budgets were not able to provide. Many other organizations helped in collecting the tabs and beverage cans including senior citizen groups, Girl and Boy Scouts troops, American Legion Posts, Masonic groups, etc. Between 1990-1994 the total pounds of tabs and aluminum was 23,556 pounds.

2a.) The year 1993 at Oriental was known as "The Year of the Clowns."

b.) The Potentate of Oriental was Ill. Alexander H. Richard. He was a member of the Oriental Clowns or Norco Clown Unit.

c.) In November 1993, a cruise was conducted through the Panama Canal. Sixty-two enjoyed the trip.

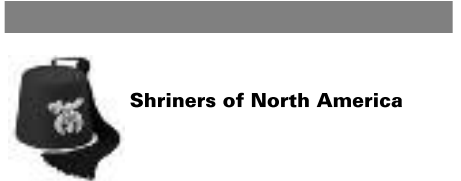
