Do You Know?

— Answers to Feb.-March Questions —

- 1.) In the February-March 1991 issue of the Oriental Magazine, there was an article on "The Fez."
- a.) A Fez is a felt cap, usually red, ornamented with a long black tassel, formerly worn by Turkish men and named after Fez, Morocco.
- b.) Historians vary as to when the fez was first introduced. Some say it first appeared around 960 A.D., others say it appeared in the 19th Century..
- c.) The first national move to a hat like this was ordered by Sultan Mahmud II, who ruled the Ottomon Empire in the early 20th Century. He banned the turban and decreed that Turks were to wear the fez.
- d.) A crimson red, the dye used for the fez was produced by a berry grown all the way across the Mediterranean
- e.) In the year 1923, the first president of Turkey, Kemal Ataturk, banned the fez.
- f.) Morocco, a supplier of the dark red dye, loved the hat and their salesmanship made it popular with almost every Moroccan Arab. Some of the best fezzes are handmade in Morocco.
- g.) Many of the finest fezzes today are made from imported English wool, dyed locally and have silk tassels.
- h.) Public awareness of the fez was inspired by such movies as "Casablanca" and "The Shanghai Gesture."
- The Samsar Jewel was given to nobles who brought into the Shrine new nobles. It was usually divided into five parts with a part added every time a noble brought in a new noble.
- 3.) On April 9, 2016, Ill. Robert Harris and Lady Jacque held the Oriental Shriners Potentate's Ball at the Holiday Inn in Saratoga.
- a.) The Potentate's Ball, twenty-five years ago, was held on April 6-7 at the Lake Placid's Mirror Lake Inn.
- b.) The Potentate in 1991 was III. Robert A. Rabe and his Lady Audrey.
- 4.) Our 39th president, Jimmy Carter (1977-81) a Nobel Peace Prize recipient and noted humanitarian, appeared in a Valentine's Day public service announcement for the Shriners Hospitals for Children that aired February 1-15, 2016.




