#### **III. PAUL D. MARINELLO** Potentate 2002

Illustrious Paul D. Marinello passed away March 13, 2018. Born Dec. 9, 1933 in Stillwater, Paul was predeceased by his wife of 37 years, Ingrid ("Billie") Weng Marinello. He is survived by his brother Daniel and two sisters, Josephine and Esther and two stepsons.

Paul enlisted as a Marine in 1953 and was honorably discharged as a Sergeant in 1956. He owned and operated Marinello Brothers Roofing and was a member of the Sheet Metal Union. Paul was very active in the Elks, the American Legion and the Order of the Eastern Star. He helped establish the support committee for the Gerald B. H. Solomon Saratoga National Cemetery. Paul was raised a Master Mason April 25, 1977 in On-De-Wa Lodge in Mechanicville and was initiated into Oriental Shrine on May 19, 1979. He was appointed Outer Guard in 1996. As he made his way up the appointed and elected line, he chaired the calendar project, several screening clinics and was active on the circus committee.


Funeral services were held on March 21 with Military Honors follow-ing at the Saratoga National Cemetery.

The Cambridge Shrine Club held its initial 2018 meeting at the Cambridge American Legion on Friday, March 9th. There were 19 nobles and ladies present.

Meeting was called to order by President III. John Garhartt at 7:00. The invocation was given by Noble Gary Burch. Those in attendance enjoyed a meal of corn beef and cabbage.

The featured speaker for the evening was Kristi Santeramo, who just returned from a mission to Guatemala. She spoke about the poverty and crime in the country. Approxi-mately 97% of the crimes against women go unsolved. Recently a fire in Guatemala killed forty-four girls and left fifteen female survivors severely burned. Those fifteen children that survived the fire were treated at a Shriners Hospital. Mrs. Santeramo spent ten days on mission in Guatemala through the local Presbyterian Church also reported on the poverty in the country. Children will spend four to five hours a day picking through the garbage dump to find food and clothing. Teachers in the country draw an average salary of \$70 per month. Most children and adults go approximately two years without dental care. While on mission, the group provided dental care to over 600 children. The presentation was well received by the nobles and ladies in attendance.

## **Do You Know?**

#### — Answers to Feb.-March Questions —

 The clown unit is one of the oldest and most prominent units in Shriners International. The first official record of Shrine clowns is found in the 1923 Imperial Session (Washington, D.C.) proceedings and mentions members of the Medinah Shrine clowns and that they visited patients at Shriner Hospitals for Children.

2a.) On May 8, 1907, Anezeh Shriners of Mexico City was chartered. More than 700 Shriners made a pilgrimage to Mexico City to watch the ceremonial to initiate new members.

b.) Porfirio Diaz, President of Mexico, along with the Secretary of Foreign Affairs and a general in the Mexican army, became Shriners during the event.

3.) On June 6, 1918, Abou Saad Shriners were chartered in Panama City, Republic of Panama, in the Balboa district at the Pacific entrance to the Panama Canal.

4a.) In the early days of the fraternity, through the 1950s, Shrine headquarters business was managed out of the home or office of the Imperial Recorder.

b.) As the Shrine fraternity grew, pressures increased to relocate the headquarters to a city that would be geographically convenient to all Shrine temples. In 1958, the Shrine rented the first office space for the headquarters at 35 East Wacker Drive in Chicago. A year later it purchased an office building at 323 N. Michigan Avenue in Chicago, moving operations there in 1961.

c.) At a special Session held on April 10, 1978, representatives of the Shrine temples voted to relocate Shrine International Headquarters to 2900 Rocky Point Drive in Tampa, Florida, where it remains today.

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
