

#### — Answers to November Questions —

- 1a.) The Imperial First Lake, Patsy Cain's program for 2018-19, is "Little Pops of Love."
- b.) "Little Pops of Love" will support the Pediatric, Orthotic and Prosthetic Services (POPS) of Shriner Hospitals for Children. The POPS staff members have created devices that allow children with limb deficiencies to play musical instruments, participate in sports and have a better quality of life.
- c.) In the past year, 2017, the POPS program provided 51,852 devices, 49,647 orthotics, and 2,205 prosthetics.
- 2.) The newly elected Outer Guard, Mark Hartz, is a member of Boumi Shriners. Boumi Shriners were the host when the Imperial Session was held in Baltimore in 2005.
- 3.) Our new National Patient Ambassadors for 2018-19 are Riley and Lily.

Riley, who is 17, was born with hereditary multiple exostosis (HME), a genetic condition that causes irregular bone growth. Exostoses are commonly known as "bone spurs" which grow on the end of long bones during childhood and adolescence. Doctors diagnosed growths from nearly head to toe through a bull body x-ray when he was 15 months old. He was a patient of Shriners Hospitals for Children — Tampa.

Lily, age 18, is from Paducah, Kentucky, and was born with fibular hemimelia. She thus did not have a fibula, the outer thin bone that runs from the knee to the ankle in her right leg. She had a Syme's amputation, an amputation done through the ankle joint that helps to preserve the heel pad. She received her first prosthesis a few months later. She received her pediatric surgeries from the Shriners Hospitals for Children Medical Center — Lexington.

- f.) Ill. Kenneth Stannard's successor as Potentate of Oriental was Ill. Robert A. Rabe in 1991. He passed away earlier this year, 2018.
- g-1.) The Imperial Session in 1990 was held in Chicago, Illinois.
- g-2.) At the Imperial Session in 1990 Oriental's nobles and ladies stayed at the "Inn of Chicago," which was part of the Best Western chain.
- g-3.) The Benefit Basketball Game held at the Imperial session was played by the Chicago White Sox and the Detroit Tigers.
- h.) The Spring Ceremonial was held on Saturday, May 18, 1990, at the Ramada Inn Resort in Lake George.


