On Veterans Day weekend 2013, USS GERALD R. FORD (CVN78) was christened at Newport News, Virginia. GERALD R. FORD is the lead ship of a new class of supercarriers that will replace the NIMITZ class aircraft carriers. The keel for the ship was laid down in November 2009, in a ceremony not unlike the Masonic laying of a cornerstone.

GERALD R. FORD is named after Shrine Mason, and former President, Gerald R. Ford. Noble Ford became a Master Mason after entering Congress. He began his Masonic journey by petitioning Malta Lodge No. 465 in Grand Rapids, Michigan. He received the Entered Apprentice Degree on July 14, 1949, and was passed to the Degree of Fellowcraft on April 20, 1951. As a courtesy to Malta Lodge, his raising to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason took place in Columbia Lodge No. 3 in Washington, D.C., on May 18, 1951. Ford completed his Scottish Rite Degrees in the Valley of Grand Rapids on October 17, 1957, and received the 33° Degree on September 26, 1962. In 1959, he became a noble of Saladin Shrine Temple No. 27, in Grand Rapids.

Nearly 20,000 people attended the christening ceremony. Ford was honored as an Eagle Scout with the display of 78 American flags by Boy Scouts from Michigan and Virginia. The University of Michigan marching band performed to recognize his star football performance for the Wolverines. Shipmates from USS MONTEREY, the aircraft carrier Ford served on in World War II, attended. Speakers included former Vice President Dick Cheney and former Defense Secretary Donald Rumsfeld, who both worked for Ford, as well as U.S. Sen. Carl Levin. D-Mich., chairman of the Senate Armed Services Committee. They shared personal tributes of Ford's integrity, compassion and leadership in a tumultuous time in American politics. Levin spoke warmly of Ford's elevation to the presidency following Richard Nixon's resignation in the Watergate scandal.

"Gerald Ford sought to replace division and doubt with unity and hope," said Levin. "He was the right man for the time."

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
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
