

## **Do You Know?**

BYRON MOAK, PP, Historian

#### — Answers to December Questions —

1.) At the first Imperial Session parade in 1892, held in Omaha, Nebraska, the highlight of the parade was a mechanical elephant built by Moslem Shriners that trumpeted a flag reading "Shriners Welcome" when its trunk was pulled.

2.) The first documented charitable act of Shriners International was in 1888, in Jacksonville, Florida, when a yellow-fever epidemic sickened 5,000 and caused the deaths of more than 400 of the city's 20,000 residents. Morocco Shriners organized a relief corps and other Shriners across the U.S. and other Masonic groups, collected more than \$10,000 to support relief efforts.

3.) In 1889 and 1900, Shriners showed their philanthropic efforts. In May, 1889, more than 2,200 people lost their lives due to a flood in Johnstown, Pennsylvania. Shrine temples throughout the U.S. contributed thousands of dollars for the relief of victims. In September, 1900, a hurricane devastated Galveston, Texas, and temples from all over the country donated money, clothing and food.

4a.) The 1942 East-West Shrine game was played at Tulane University Stadium in New Orleans. The Japanese had attacked Pearl Harbor in December, 1941 and the U.S. had entered World War II. Military officials had prohibited mass events along the West Coast.

b.) Of the first 80 East-West Shrine games, 79 were held in San Francisco.

c.) Since San Francisco, East-West Shrine games have been played in San Antonio and Houston, TX. and Orlando and St. Petersburg, FL.




