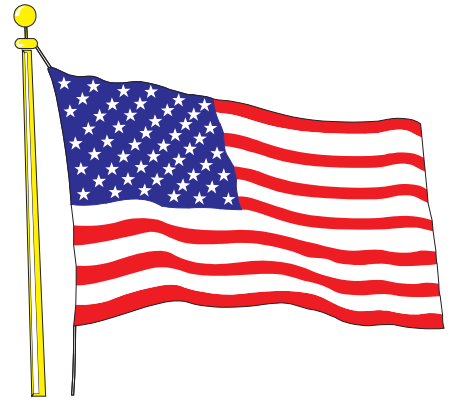
Oriental Shriners have Great Day at Lake George Polar Plunge

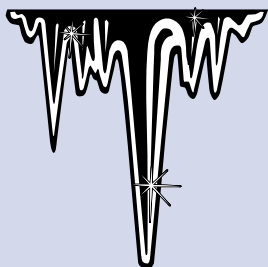
