IRA Rollover Extended

Good news! The 2010 tax act, passed by Congress in late December, has extended a benefit for certain IRA owners. For tax years 2010 and 2011, tax-free distributions of up to \$100,000 per taxpayer, per year, can be made from IRAs to charities by individuals 70½ and older. Because the tax law was passed late in 2010, it included a provision to allow individuals to make such charitable transfers during January of 2011 – and treat them as if they were made during 2010. Note that the transfers to charity can be made from a traditional IRA or Roth IRA. These distributions can also be used to satisfy annual required minimum distributions (RMDs). Fund Hope for Disabled Recyclable Contributions

STILLWATER – Tom Messore is proof positive that a little bit of help can make a big difference.

The Stillwater (NY) resident and World War II Navy veteran collects tiny pull tabs off the tops of aluminum cans that are recycled with money benefiting Shriners Hospitals for Children.

For Messore, 86, the "Pull Tabs for Kids" project really hit home when he learned that 3-1/2-year-old Karissa Mitchell, also of Stillwater, is awaiting a prosthetic device. She is an extremely active, energetic little girl, but has had no right hand since birth.

"She loves to run, play soccer, dance like a ballerina and play on a computer," said her mother, Maria.

On December 8th, Karissa is scheduled to be fitted for a prosthetic device at Shriners Hospital in Springfield, MA. "I just want her to see if it's something she's interested in," her mother said.

Karissa is already seeing physical and occupational therapists who have helped her learn how to do various activities, even how to use scissors.

Maria and her husband, Michael, also have an 11-year-old daughter, Londyn. Messore learned about Karissa from his granddaughter, Angela Messore, whose children are Londyn's friends.

Messore has collected thousands of the tiny pull tabs, mostly from friends and acquaintances. "That's the best part of it; I don't drink," he said, smiling.

Shriners Hospitals in Springfield and Boston have been collecting pull tabs from beverage cans since 1989, recycling them and putting the money toward programs that directly benefit children. More than a half-million pounds worth of tabs have been collected and recycled to date.

Tabs are the only pure aluminum part of the can, which may still be returned for deposit.

Recycled tabs have helped pay for a variety of equipment, such as a Baxter infusion pump, used to dispense pain medication; an arthometer, used to measure the degree of instability in a knee; a Bullard laryngoscope, used by anesthesiologists to place a breathing tube in patients who have a complex airway; a 10-foot trailer used to transport medical equipment and New England; and computerized wheelchair seating.

The Shriners operate 18 hospitals throughout the United States, Montreal, Canada and Mexico City for children with orthopedic problems and burns. All medical treatment is administered without cost to the patient and their family.

The Mitchells will take the tabs with them for delivery when they go to the Shriners Hospital on Dec. 8.

"They use the tabs to buy things for children they wouldn't otherwise have funds for," Maria said

Messore said Karissa has inspired him to collect every pull tab he can find.




