Alan W. Madsen Elected Imperial Potentate of Shriners International

During the 2012 Imperial Session, held in Charlotte, N.C., July 1-5, Alan W. Madsen of Cornelius, N.C., was elected Imperial Potentate of Shriners International, making him the highest-ranking Shriner in the world. In this role, he serves as President of the Board of Directors for Shriners International and Chairman of the Board of Directors for Shriners Hospitals for Children®.

Born in Manistee, Mich., Madsen served four years in the U.S. Navy, both onshore at NAS Whiting Field in Pensacola, Fla., and aboard the USS Shangri-La (CVA 38) based in Mayport, Fla. In 1966 he received his Honorable Discharge from the U.S. Navy.

After graduating from Central Michigan University in Mount Pleasant, Mich., where he received a bachelor's degree in business with a minor in psychology and journalism, he worked for Cummins Engine Company in Fostoria, Ohio, Mobile Oil Corporation in Cleveland, Ohio and Midrex Corporation in Charlotte, N.C.

In 1975, he and his wife, Jan, established Corporate Personnel Consultants, Inc., in Charlotte. They owned the company until selling the firm in 1998 to the Personnel Group of America (PGA), at which time they both took an early retirement.

Raised a Master Mason in Excelsior Lodge #261 in Charlotte, N.C., Madsen is also a member of the Charlotte York Rite and Scottish Rite bodies. He joined Oasis Shriners in 1981, was appointed to the Oasis Divan in 1992, and served as the Potentate in 2000. Madsen is a member of the Oasis Marching Patrol, the Royal Order of Jesters and the Order of Quetzalcoatl. He also has served as Captain of the Patrol Color Guard, Chairman of the Paper and Plaque Sales Project, Editor of "Desert Dust," Chairman of the Publicity Committee for the Oasis Centennial, and Chairman of Advertising and Promotions for the Oasis Shrine Circus. In 2007 he became the Past Director of the Royal Order of Jesters Court #109 in Charlotte.

A Certified Personnel Consultant, Madsen serves on the Advisory Board for Branch Bank & Trust Corporation, and is a former member of the Development Board at Central Michigan University. He served for three years on the Grand Lodge of North Carolina's Committee for Finance. Madsen is a former member of the Advisory Boards of United Carolina Bank and the Charlotte Chamber of Commerce, and he has been a member of several professional and civic organizations.


He currently serves as Chairman of the Revenue Cycle Committee for Third Party Pay, and also serves on the Research, East-West Shrine Game, Investments, Information Services, and Special Projects/Fund Raising Committees. In addition, he has served as the Liaison to Shriners Hospitals for Children at Salt Lake City, Portland, Lexington, Tampa and Shreveport.

Madsen has also served on the Budget, Planning, Salary Personnel & Retirement, and Strategic Planning for Shriners Hospitals for Children, Insurance and Information Services Committees. He has served as the Chairman of Educational Seminars, Fraternal Strategic Planning, Salaried Personnel and Retirement, and the Shrine Futures Study (2005-2006).

Madsen and his wife Jan have two adult children, Paul, a Pilot (Captain) for Southwest, and Lisa, a Registered Nurse who lives in South Carolina. Al and Jan have one grandchild, Ryan, who lives in North Salt Lake City, Utah.

Madsen has been very active in his church, serving on the church council and building committee. He is a certified open-water diver and life-member of Alpha Kappa Psi, a national business fraternity.





We often overlook the effort and support of parents who cultivate the talents of their offspring. Cornbread is Breadcrumb's Dad. They attend classes together; they dress and make up together; they appear together; they perform together; and Cornbread has inspired Breadcrumb to aspire to excellence. We think this is awesome on both their parts!

Clown Community Spirit Award to Byron "Blueberry" Moak.

"Blueberry" discovered the art of clowning later in life. With a great sense of humor, a willingness to learn and take risk, combined with a dash of color and a nod to traditional clown entertainment, Byron and his various characters share his laugh making spirit in a exceptional way throughout our Capital District community and beyond.

Enthusiasm Award to Nick "Breadcrumb" Edwards.

"Breadcrumb" is an impressive junior joey. As a youngster he has often appeared in Shrine Circuses and the Montreal St. Patrick's Day Parade, entertaining crowds exceeding 500,000 people. Nick regularly participates in CRCAF happenings and as a participant in the 2012 edition of the Northeast Clown Institute he was the first place character clown, competing against clowns from all over the Northeast and Canada. While he is often seen out and about with his Dad and the NORCO Clowns, his enthusiasm for the art of clowning positively impacts even the most seasoned performer.

Lifetime Achievement Award to NORCO Clowns.

- Answers to June 2012 Questions -1a.) Alfred G. Arvold was the Imperial Potentate from 1944 45 Ho was a member of El Zagal Springer which

1944-45. He was a member of El Zagal Shriners which is located in Fargo, North Dakota.

b.) The Imperial Potentate, Alfred G. Arvold, was the only Imperial Potentate who had no Imperial Session to preside over. Only national Shrine officers and hospital trustees gathered in Chicago in 1945. One can speculate that many nobles were on various war fronts during World War II, were working in war industries and there was rationing of gasoline and other items. These were probably some of the factors in not having a regular Imperial Session.

c.) Imperial Potentate Alfred G. Arvold initiated, designed and made real his personal dream of a special display room in the George Washington National Masonic Memorial in Alexandria, Virginia. These Shrine rooms now are called Shrine Rooms East and were refurbished in 1963

2a.) The Oasis Club was a place for Shriners' recreation. Organized by Oriental Shriners, it was used for club dinners and card parties. One could enjoy a friendly game of pool or a sociable game of cards. Members of the Shrine Band had rehearsals there before a concert.

b.) The Oasis Club Room was located in the Troy Union Railroad Station. Railroad patrons enjoyed hearing the rehearsals of the Shrine Band waiting for their trains.

Shriners Hospitals for Children: Why They Are Important

There are 22 Shriners Hospitals for Children[®] in the U.S., Canada and Mexico. The renowned hospital system provides excellent pediatric specialty care to children with orthopaedic conditions, burns, spinal cord injuries, and cleft lip and palate, regardless of the patients' ability to pay. Shriners Hospitals for Children has helped nearly 1 million children overcome exceedingly difficult challenges and achieve more than believed possible.

A History of Specialty Care

The first Shriners Hospitals for Children – opened in the 1920s – were established primarily to care for children who had contracted polio. Today, there are 20 Shriners Hospitals for Children providing care for children with all types of orthopaedic conditions, including clubfoot, hip disorders, limb deficiencies and deformities, scoliosis, and orthopaedic difficulties related to cerebral palsy and other neuromuscular conditions.

In the mid-1960s, Shriners became aware of a lack of medical expertise in pediatric burn care and opened three hospitals specializing in acute and rehabilitative burn care. These hospitals are the only ones initially established exclusively for the treatment of pediatric burns and related conditions. A fourth hospital in our health care system offering treatment for burns also provides care for orthopaedic conditions, spinal cord injury and cleft lip and palate. These hospitals continue to be pioneers in pediatric burn treatment and research and are recognized as leaders in the development of improved and innovative treatment techniques.

In the early 1980s, the Shriners fraternity opened the nation's first pediatric spinal cord injury rehabilitation centers. There, patients find the complete range of services needed to recover to the fullest extent possible.

Cleft lip and palate is the health care system's fourth service line. Facial clefts are one of the most common birth defects in the U.S. Despite the frequency of its occurrence, and the severity of the deformities, care for patients with cleft lip and palate can be difficult to obtain. Shriners Hospitals for Children is committed to improving care for children with this condition through a comprehensive, coordinated program of clinical excellence, teaching and research.



Being Eligible for Care

Admission to our hospitals is based solely on medical need. All children, under the age of 18, are eligible for care if there is a reasonable possibility they could benefit from the specialized services available. All services are provided regardless of the ability to pay.

Sharing Knowledge and Expertise

Shriners Hospitals for Children is dedicated to conducting innovative research to provide answers to complex medical difficulties affecting children. The organization's research efforts not only benefit our patients, they contribute to the overall body of medical knowledge.

The health care system is also proud of its role in medical education. In the past 20 years, approximately 9,500 physicians have received residency education or postgraduate fellowships at our hospitals.


