Dale W. Stauss Elected Imperial Potentate

During the 2014 Imperial Session, held in Minneapolis July 6-July 10, Dale W. Stauss of Grand Forks, N.D., was elected Imperial Potentate of Shriners International, making him the highest ranking Shriner in the world. In this role, he serves as President of the Board of Directors of Shriners International and Chairman of the Board of Directors of Shriners Hospitals for Children®.

Founded in 1872, Shriners International is a fraternity based on fun, fellowship and the Masonic principles of brotherly love, relief and truth. The fraternity founded Shriners Hospitals for Children as its official philanthropy in 1922. What began as one hospital is now a world-renowned health care system with 22 locations in three countries that provide advanced care for children with orthopaedic conditions, burns, spinal cord injuries, and cleft lip and palate, regardless of the families' ability to pay. The fraternity, which has nearly 200 temples (chapters) in several countries and thousands of clubs around the world, continues to operate and support this unique health care system.

A Mason, Shriner, business and family man, Stauss joined East Grand Forks Red River Lodge #292 in 1982, and served as Master in 1989. He is a 33rd degree member of the Scottish Rite, and a member of the Royal Order of Jesters. Stauss became a member of Kem Shriners in Grand Forks in 1982 and served as the temple's Potentate in 1997. He is a member of the Kem Drum and Bugle Corps, and he served on the board of the North Dakota Shrine Bowl for 16 years. In

1995, he received the Samsar Award for his service to Kem Shriners. In 2000, Dale served the region's Shriners as president of the Midwest Shrine Association.

As an Imperial Officer, Stauss has served as chairman of the Imperial Athletic Committee, the East-West Shrine Game, the Shriners Hospitals for Children Golf Tournament, and the Imperial Membership Committee. Stauss also served on the Planning Committee and the Buildings and Equipment Committee.

Stauss graduated from the University of North Dakota and has been involved in the real estate management field for more than 25 years. He recently retired from Century Properties, Inc., a property management company, after serving as its president for 22 years.

His civic activities include serving more than 20 years on the East Grand Forks School Board in East Grand Forks, Minn., as well as serving on the 2000 Minnesota All-State School Board. He and his wife, Cheryl, have three daughters, one son and 14 grandchildren. They enjoy spending their spare time with the family at their lake cabin.

His focus as Imperial Potentate, Stauss will continue to stress membership and emphasize clear and open communication in order to strengthen and raise awareness of both our organizations – and all they have to offer. He plans to encourage all members to make Shriners International and Shriners Hospitals for Children their priority, and to have pride in their Shriners family.

Shriners Hospitals for Children is committed to the pursuit of knowledge that improves medical care.

Researchers' Genetic Breakthrough

Recently, researchers at Shriners Hospitals for Children — Canada were the first to identify the genetic defect underlying a painful bone disease in children and teenagers. Led by Frank Rauch, M.D., a pediatrician, and Pierre Moffatt, Ph.D., a basic scientist, the team discovered that when a part of the RUNX2 gene is duplicated it causes a disease called metaphyseal dysplasia with maxillary hypoplasia and brachydactyly or MDMHB. The discovery was published in the February 2013 issue of *The American Journal of Human Genetics*.

Those with this condition endure a life of pain. Their teeth break easily and can be so painful that they have them pulled by the age of 20. As these patients grow, many have breaks in their spines, similar to what occurs in elderly people with osteoporosis. According to Dr. Rauch, "Now that we know the cause, we can identify patients with this disease earlier, and address their problems sooner."

State-of-the-art Imaging System

Offering the most up-to-date treatment options is also a hallmark of our health care system. Shriners Hospitals for Children — Portland recently opened its state-of-the-art imaging center, complete with a new EOS Imaging System. This imaging system is the first technology capable of providing 3-D full-body images of patients in a natural standing or seated position, with a low radiation dose. According to Michael Aiona, M.D., chief of staff, "EOS represents a true breakthrough, offering the most advanced low-dose X-ray technology for orthopaedic imaging."

The EOS system provides high-quality radiographic images of the skeleton. It also delivers a radiation dose up to nine times less than a computed radiology X-ray, and up to 20 times less than a CT can. This low dose makes the system of particular value for pediatric patients, especially children who need to be imaged frequently to monitor disease progression, such as those with scoliosis.

Three-dimensional body images of the skeleton allow physicians to make more informed diagnosis and treatment decisions. The new imaging center was made possible through a direct-use gift from a friend of Shriners Hospitals for Children — Portland. Do You Know?

— Answers to June 2014 Questions —

1a.) The 100 Million Dollar Club was established in 1972.

b.) The 100 Million Dollar Club was so named because the goal was to add 100 million dollars to the Endowment Fund through \$100 gifts. Nobles and their friends could realize they did not have to give thousands of dollars to aid the Shriners Hospitals for Children. A donation of \$100 given outright or \$100 in his/her will does make a difference. The contribution is also tax-deductible.

2a.) In 1979, the Board of Directors and Board of Trustees, of what was then called the Shriners Hospitals for Crippled Children, unanimously passed a resolution to raise the maximum age for admission to the hospitals for both orthopedic and burns from 16 to a patient's 18th birthdate.

b.) The change had been recommended by both the administrative and medical staffs and to allow them to more thoroughly follow the progress of the patients. The change would not create any undue administrative problems.

3a.) In 1979, the Joint Boards of Directors for what was then called the Shriners Hospitals for Crippled Children, announced that they would be extending their care of crippled and burned children to include trauma or tumor-induced spinal cord injuries.

b.) The Philadelphia Shriners Hospital would provide the new care under a five-year pilot program.

c.) According to then Dr. Howard Steel, Chief Surgeon of the Philadelphia Shriners Hospital, spinal injured children were receiving subminimal care and no structural

rehabilitation. The initial efforts would be towards rehabilitating the patient to return to acceptable social-physical living standards. Eventually it was hoped through micro-surgery, such injuries may be repairable to the extent that children would achieve semi or total function recovery.
