We Get By with A Little Help From Our Friends

Nobles and Ladies,

The above are words from a great song by the Beatles. Just one of the songs played by the tribute band "Fab Four" as entertainment at this year's Imperial Session but one that was very appropriate as we put together the circus performances for 2017. Barry "Full House" Trasacco and Lady Linda outdid themselves with nine performances at five different sites. The "help from our friends" came in the form of donated dumpsters, cut-rates on porta-potty rentals, and circus sites. At the last minute in Amsterdam we found that our usual site had some ongoing construction work requiring a last minute relocation. With all the posters and tickets printed we had to notify people of the change. RR Donnelly Construction of Mechanicville loaned us the use of an electronic sign that we could put at the entrance of the old site directing people to the new site on Route 29. Early setup of the sign by the crew of High Priest and Prophet Dan Saville resulted in the first of four absolute sell-outs of our circus performances this year. It's humbling to be a Shriner when people and businesses reach out to help us carry out our mission to help kids.

The most pleasant surprise of the Imperial Session was the announcement of Emily Mellish as one of the new patient ambassadors of Shriners Hospitals for Children. Many of you have met Emily as she attended many NYOSA meetings and Temple functions. She has been a patient at the Erie Hospital since her birth 11 years ago. As the first dancer on the floor to the Fab Four she showed that there is no limit to her energy and attitude despite her many surgeries over the years. Her effort to give back to the Shriners by making bracelets for her "Beads for Needs" Foundation has raised nearly \$80,000 for Shriners Hospitals.

Our first choice for the Temple Dinner at Imperial, reserved over a year ago, was still under renovation from last year's hurricane. Once again, our friends stepped in to help, as Potentate Wayne Towne of Ziyara, was trying to put together a NYOSA group dinner at their hotel. So Oriental dined with Ziyara, Mecca, Media, and Ismailia at the top the Shores Hotel. A spectacular view and a great opportunity to socialize with the other Shriners and their ladies from the other NYOSA Temples.

The 143rd Imperial Session in Daytona has come and gone and I'm happy to report that Shriners Hospitals for Children and our philanthropy is well managed and financially stable thanks to the dedication of the many people who support our great cause. Among the items voted upon at the session was the change of the year of Shriners International to a fiscal year that corresponds to the election of the Imperial line in July of each year. This only makes sense as the Imperial Potentate has a year and budget that clearly is his responsibility from his election in July to the next June, just prior to the election of the next Potentate. All Temples and the hospital system will continue to operate on a calendar year.

New Imperial Potentate Gary J. Bergenske can be congratulated for putting on a great Imperial Session that ran like clockwork. Quite a feat considering that we lost Imperial Sir and Recorder Jack Jones just prior to the session. The transportation system was better than anyone anticipated and our chosen hotel was one to the first stops on the route. The one floor setup of the Marketplace and Convention Center reminded one of the Indianapolis session as opposed to the daunting stairways of Tampa. Oriental has been asked to do a baker's dozen (that's 13, but who's counting) of creations as a goal by next July.

We were no sooner back from Imperial than on July 18th, we did our annual fund raiser for Shriners Hospitals selling CD's at the Saratoga Performing Arts Center. This year's performances were by Foreigner and Cheap Trick and the CD for sale was the Foreigner 40th Anniversary edition. The crew assembled by Noble Chuck Sommer sold 357 CD's for which Shriners Hospitals will receive \$1,785. In addition we collected \$244 of donations to the hospitals from people that didn't want to buy a CD but wanted to give money to the hospitals. After one day of rest we began the circus tour with Chairman Barry Trasacco and Lady Linda. Tour of Erie, PA Shriners Hospital

Following the close of the 101st Supreme Session of Daughters of the Nile held in Niagara Falls, NY, a post-tour was held to visit the Shriners Hospitals for Children® in Erie, PA on Friday, June 16, 2017. Cyrene Temple No. 18's representatives, Past Queens Rosemary Caruso, Patricia Irwin, and Sally Lebowich, and Recorder Beverly Harrington, and (Cyprus) Nobles James Caruso and Gerald Irwin, joined other Nile Princesses and a few nobles to fill two large tour buses. It was a two hour ride from Niagara Falls, NY to Erie, PA.

The Erie hospital is considerably smaller than the Springfield, Boston, and Montreal hospitals. All treatment is done on an outpatient basis. Day surgery, including pre- and post-operative care is done here. Those patients requiring overnight stays go to either the Philadelphia or Pittsburgh Shriners hospitals. Besides services like gait measurement, occupational therapy and physical therapy, speech therapy draws many patients. The Shriners hospital fills a big void in the area for children's health care.

As in the other Shriners hospitals, bright colors and decorations abound to make it child-friendly. The post-op area even boasts a large lighthouse!

Daughters of the Nile has contributed more than two million dollars to the Erie hospital.

As always, a visit to a Shriners hospital is stimulating and recommended. Erie was the seventh Shriners hospital visited by this writer.
