A Necrology report is given for Past Potentates who passed away over the previous year. Officers for the next year are elected and the Imperial Potentate is presented a check from the association for the Shriners Hospitals for Children.

d.) A Cabiri Club is found in most Shrine Centers. It is meant to help the current Potentate such as give advice on a budget and suggest possible future officers for the Shrine Center.

2a.) The photo is of Ill. Kenneth Stannard who was Potentate of Oriental Shriners in 1990.

b.) Lady Eleanor Stannard was Oriental's first lady in 1990.

c.) The Potentate's Ball was held on Saturday, April 7, 1990 at the Fort William Henry in Lake George.

d.) The Spring Ceremonial was held on Saturday, May 19, 1990 at the Ramada Inn in Lake George. The Fall Ceremonial was held on Saturday, November 10, 1990 at the Lake Placid Hilton. Those attending will remember the heavy snowfall that evening and the power outage the next morning.

e.) The Imperial Session was held from July 1-6, 1990 in Chicago.

f.) Imperial Sessions had been held in Chicago ten times before 1990. They were there: 1889, 1906, 1942, 1943, 1945, 1949, 1955, 1958, 1963 and 1968.

g.) In 1990 Oriental's nobles and ladies stayed at the Inn of Chicago at the Imperial Session.

Local Boy Sets Example for Giving Back to Community

MELROSE – Kids are always told what to do and sometimes may not understand why, so when one takes the initiative for a great cause it is all the more impressive. Jake Buckley, 8, of Melrose has set an example for all as he donated about 50 to 75 pounds of aluminum can pull-tabs for recycling and all proceeds go to benefit children at Shriners Hospital in Springfield, MA.



"We've been collecting for about ten years," said Kathy Buckley, Jake's grandmother. "The twins (Jake and his brother Jack) are eight so they've been introduced to pulling the tabs off of cans, not knowing why but they just pull them off and Jake just decided he was going to run with it. Last year he was telling everybody at their campground and anybody his mom worked with, they've been going gungho and they figure it was close to 50 pounds. This was the first haul that he did and we've already got a few pounds for the next one."

Local couple Merrel and Dottie Allen helped Jake get the tabs to the recycling facilities. As volunteer work, they have been helping the region turn them in for several years now. "Around back in October, I'd say there was 75 pounds of them, said Merrel Allen of Jake's haul. "I bring them in my garage, go through them and make sure there is no metal in it. I use a magnet and go through all of them.



There cannot be any metal in them. They've got to be all aluminum. I take them right down to the junk yard, they weigh it up and see how much it is, and give me the check for Shriners."

Merrel said there are two places he goes, the port of Albany, and Kelman's in Troy. He said he collects them from all over the region, including about 80 pounds the other day from the Harley Davidson shop in Brunswick. His wife Dottie Allen noted donations can range from dozens of pounds to just a zip-lock bag full. Merrel cannot explain how some people get so many tabs. "I don't know, either they've been keeping them for a real long time or somebody's drinking a lot..." said Merrel Allen. Merrel spoke highly of Jake's effort. "He's a very good kid," he said. I was really unarticated be bad on more the said. I was really surprised he had so many. He said he went around and collected from all his friends and neighbors and everybody. I gave him one of the Shriner's hats. "Dottie Allen noted all of the money goes for a good cause. They use the money for kid's transportation and other services over at the hospital in Springfield," she said. Jake's father, Paul Buckley is also proud of him. "Jake first started doing this work about a year ago," he said. "It's the most I have ever seen donated by a seven year old. Through all his friends and family, they collect them, bring them to me and once we get enough I put them in garbage bags and call up Shriner's and they come pick them up. This last time they gave him a hat for helping us out.

Even Jake himself gave a statement. "I enjoy collecting the tabs to help the children at the hospital," he said. About 1130 tabs make a pound. Normally a pound gets \$1 (The Allens got \$400 their first year). Today they had to settle for 60 cents a pound as the price of aluminum has come down a bit. "It's a great thing, and we just want everyone to keep on contributing," said Dottie Allen. Merrel can be reached at 518-753-4589 to contribute pull-tabs for this cause.

The tailgate party consisted of a wide variety of great summer food prepared by so many! We also had a celebration of **Harold Goodsell's** birthday, which included members of his family.


















I'm the Member Who Never Came Back
