

Do You Know?

— Answers to May Questions —

- Of the 22 Shriners Hospitals for Children, those that are designated as research centers are: Boston, Montreal, Cincinnati, Philadelphia, Sacramento-California, Galveston-Texas, and Portland-Oregon.
- 2a.) Of newborn babies, about 30 percent may have a developmental abnormality of the shaping of the ears.
- b.) In many cases this developmental abnormality of the shaping of the ears can be corrected if treatment is started within the first month of life. This is because a newborn continues to carry the mother's estrogen for about three months. After three months the estrogen is gone and cartilage becomes stiff and not easy to change.
- c.) The Shriners Hospital for Children at Springfield uses a nonsurgical approach to correcting the ear abnormality by

molding the patient's ear with an EarWell. The EarWell is worn for five to six weeks and slowly changes the shape of the ear. This process has a good success rate.

d.) The EarWell approach can help those babies with a protruding ear more than 10mm from scalp, lack of an antihelix rim, folding of the helix rim (lidding or cup ear) and conchal









3a.) EOS is a unique ultra-low dose x-ray system that utilizes

Nobel Prize-winning technology to reduce the amount of radiation received during an x-ray procedure. Radiation exposure to patients is 50-85 percent lower than standard digital radiography systems and 95 percent lower than a computed tomography (CT) scan.

- b.) This reduced radiation is important to Shriners Hospitals for Children at Springfield because many of the patients, depending on their conditions, are x-rayed multiple times over the course of their treatment. For example, those with idiopathic scoliosis have x-rays frequently to monitor curve progression, which can increase the risk of developing a cancer later in life. EOS meets the best practice standard known as "ALARA" without sacrificing high quality images needed to make medical decisions and reduce the risk of developing certain types of cancer in the future.
- 4.) Some former national ambassadors for the Shriners Hospitals for Children have become top athletes. Katie Ladlie was born with a vascular malformation in her left leg which led to complete deterioration of her knee cartilage. Her left leg was amputated at the St. Louis Shriners Hospital and she was fitted with prosthetics. She was recently named a member of the U.S. Women's Sled Hockey team. She competes in triathlons, swimming and is a member of her high school track team

Hunter Woodhall, of Syracuse, Utah, returned from the 2015 International Paralympic Committee Athletics World Championships with two medals in track events. He wishes to participate in the 2016 Paralympic Games in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. Hunter has two prosthetic legs and was born with fibular hemimelia of the left leg, a shortening or absence of the two bones in the calf. His right ankle was fused. At the Shriners Hospital in Tampa, Hunter's feet were amputated at age 11 months. When his family moved to Syracuse, Utah, Hunter became a patient at the Shriners Hospitals for Children–Salt Lake City. The Shriners Hospital fitted Hunter with some of the first-of-its-kind custom feet as well as special liners for wrestling.


