1.) This year the Imperial Session is in Daytona Beach, Florida. The five U.S. states with the most Imperial Sessions are: New York–21, California–13, Illinois–11, Florida–9 and Texas–7.

2a.) Shriners observe International Awareness Day on June 6th. It was on June 6, 1876, that the Imperial Council, the original governing body of the Shriner fraternity, was founded.

b.) The purpose of Shriners International Day is to encourage nobles to celebrate their great fraternity and raise awareness of its importance in the communities.

c.) Some ways nobles and Shrine Centers can observe International Awareness Day are: wearing your fez during an official Shrine function; wear a hat, shirt, lapel pin or other item with the fraternal logo. Family members could wear appropriate clothing items that promote the fraternity. Other ideas are to organize an event at your Shrine center and invite the public to participate which will increase awareness of Shriners International. Promote Shriners International Awareness Day on the temple website and social media pages. Distribute Shriner primer and pocket petitions to potential prospects during community events. 

Nobles: A little bit of a lot of things this month!

First of all, please review my article last month about Masons On Line. It is a very useful resource for all of our membership as well as the leaders of our clubs and units. The calendar function and the ability to make reservations alone make it worthwhile. Also we are posting all Temple events including parades etc. there, so you can quickly keep track of all of your Shrine Center's activities.

Along the same lines, the membership system of Imperial has been opened up to all Nobles. Please sign up and check your personal information on WebFez. It is a simple process, but if you have problems, please give me a call. It would help me a great deal if you would verify your personal information and enter corrections. That way we can make sure that we can communicate effectively with you.

Finally, for as long as anyone can remember (I mean decades!) the portion of your dues that the Temple retains has been set at \$21.15. Noone can remember why it's such an oddball amount or when it was set (I have found records back to 1984 where the dues included the \$0.15) That is over 30 years ago!

So, in an attempt to make life a little simpler for all, there will be a Stated Meeting on July 18th (see announcement elsewhere in this issue) where one of the items for debate will be a proposal to raise the Temple dues by \$3.85 so that they are an even \$25.00.

Please note that this will be the first increase in the money your Shrine Center retains to support Your Temple. I know that there have been significant increases in dues since 1984, but every penny of that money has gone to Imperial, not to Oriental. Dues for Imperial in 1984 were \$5.00 plus the \$21.15 for Oriental (total of \$26.15). Imperial's share for 2017 was \$35.00 (\$5.00 for hospital and \$30.00 for per-capita.) Adding in the same \$21.15 you get the current dues bill of \$56.15.

In proposing this increase, we realize that there will be a minimal increase in revenue to the Shrine Center. We are proposing it to simplify your and my life – we just think that it is a lot easier to write a check for \$60.00 rather than \$56.15.

Please let us know your thoughts on this item, and plan to attend the Stated Meeting.

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
