

Six diseases that the Carter Center has fought against are Guinea Worm, River blindness, Trachoma, Schistosomiasis, Lymphatic filariasis and Malaria.

3a.) The first Shrine East-West Football game was held in 1925.

b.) In the most recent 91st East-West game, held at Tropicana Field in St. Petersburg, FL, on January 23, 2016, the West beat the East 29-9.



With no other business on hand the meeting was closed with the Benediction by P.P. Byron Moak.

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
