

## **Shriners Hospitals for Children:**

#### Leading in Burn Research and Education

Shriners Hospitals for Children® is recognized worldwide for its work in burn care, including its support of innovative research studies. Currently, Shriners Hospitals for Children is funding approximately 40 research studies involving different aspects of burn injury and treatment.

One research project being conducted by Kiho Cho, D.V.M., Ph.D., associate investigator, and David Greenhalgh, M.D., chief of burns at Shriners Hospitals for Children — Northern California, has revealed a potential new strategy for treating patients with severe burn injuries. Their work involves a study of endogenous retroviruses, which are remnants of viral infections that are typically dormant inside our bodies.

"In our initial studies we discovered that stress from severe burns can awaken these retroviruses and it is probable that some of them may trigger the infection or inflammation response within the body," said Dr. Cho.

Dr. Cho and his team also analyzed blood samples from children with severe burn injuries and identified patient-specific activation of endogenous retroviruses, which may be associated with inflammatory response in these patients.

"We hope to confirm that a link exists between the activation of endogenous retroviruses and subsequent inflammation and internal organ failure in burn patients," said Dr. Cho. "This may then lead to establishment of drug therapies to block specific retroviral activities, and thereby alter the course of the burn patients' response and save lives."

An example of our leadership in medical education can be found at our Galveston hospital.

Shriners Hospitals for Children — Galveston, in partnership with the University of Texas Medical Branch (UTMB), is the only burn center with a surgical critical care fellowship program approved by the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education.

The one-year program, started in 2003, is open to general surgeons who have completed general surgery residency or at least three years of residency training, and accepts two fellows per year.

"The goal of the program is to train surgeons to become leaders in the field of burn surgery and surgical critical care," said Program Director Jong Lee, M.D., surgeon at Shriners Hospitals for Children — Galveston and associate professor of surgery at UTMB.

"As a burn surgeon, you deal with some of the most critically ill patients and critical care skills are very important."

After completing the fellowship, participants will be both competent surgical intensivists and burn surgeons.

These are only a very few examples of the many ways Shriners Hospitals for Children is a leader in burn care research and education. More examples can be found at our four hospitals that provide expert pediatric burn care, as well as in the lives of the thousands of children with burn injuries we have cared for.
