Our Installation of Officers and Annual Meeting will be on January 14th. It should be a great party! Please come and join us for the fun!



Doors will open at 12 noon and allow for socialization before the start of the meeting. The Stated Meeting will begin **promptly** at 1:00 p.m.


The main purpose of this meeting will be to elect the **2017 Potentate** and the **2017 Divan.**

— Answers to Sept.-Oct. Questions —

1.) In order to reduce the need for another member assessment, as was done at the Imperial Session in Houston in 2015, the Imperial Divan put forth in Tampa, a Six-Pack Package:

(1) Cover costs of the Shrine Magazine by selling advertisements.

(2) Build awareness of the fraternity by communicating with the members to encourage gifts, contributions and bequests.

(3) Cover costs of seminars by establishing a fair mileage reimbursement of about 30 cents.

(4) Cover costs of educational seminars by implement-

ing a tax-deductible Shriners Educational Foundation to which Shriners and the public can donate.

(5) Sell a yearly collectible item.

(6) Cover the cost of updating our Shrine data with a third party directory.

2.) The 92nd East-West Shrine football game will be held at Tropicana Field in St. Petersburg, Florida, on Saturday, January 21, 2017.

3.) The net loss of members reported at the Imperial Session was the least number lost since 1983.

4.) Lady Lisa Gantt, in her program "In Dreams I Walk," selling pins for the ladies and Shrine ties for the nobles, for doing increased research on brittle bones (0.1.) realized over \$441,000 – a record amount raised.

5.) The new national Patient Ambassadors for 2016-17:

(1) Karoline Nogues was born with a significant leg discrepancy and her family ultimately brought her to the Shriners Hospital for Children at Shreveport. There she began a lengthening treatment that would take nine years, also multiple surgeries and the use of an external factor that would lengthen her leg incrementally. Her leg, when the process was complete, had lengthened seven inches. At age 16, Karolina practices horseback riding and enjoys surfing, which requires the use and strenth of her leg. She wants to apply to a Disney program for animation after high school

(2) Marius Woodward is originally from Romania. He was the victim of a house fire that took both his parents' lives. Burned over 75% of his body, he also lost his fingers and his nose. Two students from Brigham Young University enlisted their families assistance and Marius was brought to the U.S. for better care. The family of Ashley Woodward adopted Marius and brought him for treatment to the Shriners Hospital in Los Angeles. Here Marius received many surgeries including multiple toe-to-hand transfers which would allow him to be more independent. Marius is believed to the the first in the world to have a transfer of this type involving six toes. A high school student of 17, sespite having two toes and six new fingers, he is able to play soccer and football. Marius wants to be a motivational speaker and a model to demonstrate that his scars made him who he is and to encourage acceptance despite outward appearance.

Montreal Shriners Hospital Draw for Nile Northeast Days

On Thursday, October 20, 2016, Princess Recorder Beverly A. Harrington and Past Queen Sally O. Lebowich of Cyrene Temple No. 18, Daughters of the Nile, headed up to Dorval, Quebec (a suburb of Montreal) to attend DON's Northeast Days. It was hosted by Oasis Temple No. 46. Though the teeming rain did not let up until Sunday, it did not dampen "Montreal Shades of Autumn Days" going on in the hotel.

Thursday evening was "Shades of Witches of the Northeast" and showed some very scary witches! The best witch at each dinner table was called up as a finalist, including Past Imperial First Lady and DON Canadian Trustee Pr. Shirley Smith. First place was a two-way tie.

Following breakfast on Friday, participants (including some nobles) filled two (school) buses and a van and headed to the Shriners Hospital for Children® Montreal. There we were divided into groups of about 20, led by volunteers. Though we could not see some areas, we saw a lot of the hospital.

Each floor has a theme, e.g. water, the plains, sports, etc. That theme is carried out with very colorful murals in the halls and individual rooms, flooring patterns to go with that floor's theme, etc. As in the other Shriners Hospitals, most care is out-patient; there are only 22 in-patient rooms. All are private rooms with a couch for a parent to sleep. These rooms have signs outside the doors indicating the Shrine Center contributing to it. The Oriental room was occupied, so we could not see the inside.

In the basement, when people come in from the parking garage, is a museum with information about Shriners and the hospitals. There is a display case with a fez from each Shrine Center supporting the hospital, including Oriental.

The most modern equipment, including several of the new low radiation x-ray machines are installed. The research and laboratory area has increased several fold from the old hospital.

Daughters of the Nile has contributed over five million dollars to the Montreal hospital. In addition to the plaque in the entrance lobby, the second floor has been dedicated to the Daughters of the Nile. In a large conference room there, we were treated to delicious buffet lunch. That was followed by a program with two speakers from the Social Services staff and a patient. Jeffrey, a seventeen-year old young man has been a Shriners patient since he was five months old. He was born without a right hand or a right foot. In elementary school, the other children would call him names; in the seventh grade, they stole his prosthesis. He is spokesperson for the Cana-dian campaign "Cut The Bull" to fight bullying. Though english is his second language, he spoke very well. Canadian Trustee Pr. Shirley Smith then cut a beautiful cake in honor of Daughters of the Nile. Following dessert, the buses took us back to the hotel.

The evening followed the day's theme of "Shades of our Beautiful Children." Preceding

dinner we were treated to dance performances by children studying at two different dance schools. The children covered a big age range, and performed in various dance styles. All were very good.




